## 2024 Poster Contest for North Port High School students

The mission of North Port Friends of Wildlife is to raise awareness about our native wildlife while stressing the importance of protecting its habitat and in general, our natural world. We think with the help of various esteemed teachers of North Port High and supporting help, this contest will help in that objective.

We realize that reaching the youth of today is critical for they are indeed tomorrow's future. We think the timing of this is appropriate with National Endangered Species Day right around the corner, which is set for May 17th, 2024.

A rubric will be used to provide key points of focus along with some general guidelines; you will find the details attached herein. Programs include LIFE, an environmental education program on conservation lands for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students; the Florida Master Naturalist Program, an adult education program about Florida's ecosystems; EcoWalks, guided interpretive trail hikes on our County Preserves; Natural Areas Story Maps, a virtual interpretive tour of our most unique County parks, preserves, and trails; Eco-Explorer backpack kits, backpack kits for free checkout at our Sarasota County Libraries designed to inspire eco-friendly living inside and out; and

public presentations. Dr. Katherine lived with her Park Ranger husband, 2 children, and many animals in a Florida State Park for over 20 years. She is passionate about making a difference in our world through educating about our natural environment. As a former physician, she believes the health of the environment is intricately linked with our own health and well-being.
